ATTENDANCE

As you may have noticed the Department of Education have launched an attendance campaign, entitled "Miss School, Miss Out." The campaign seeks to highlight the fact that school attendance is not just essential, it's also beneficial and that in missing out on a range of positive life experiences. It is extremely important that your child attends school every day. If your child is off school, please inform the class teacher in writing or phone the office and let Noeleen know the reason for the absence. Please note if your child's attendance falls below 85%, the Education Welfare Officer will ask you to present evidence to justify such absences.

LANGUAGE CLASSES

Mandarin Chinese and French classes will continue to be offered on a weekly basis to our P6 and P7 children. All classes will have Spanish lessons.

DEVELOPING YOUR CHILDS MATH AND LITERACY SKILLS

Parents often ask how they can help develop their child's math skills. Last year, we purchased 'Mathletics' which can be accessed by the pupils from P1-P7. Children will be given a username and a password this week. This will enable them to access Mathletics at home. The programme covers all areas of Numeracy and is well worth a visit. If you would like to know more about this programme, please speak to Mrs Kelly. We also intend to hold parents' sessions later this term, to provide you with information on the math's your child will do at each stage of their learning. Mrs Kelly will provide further information on this over the coming weeks.

We also have the Accelerated Reading (AR) programme in the school. Many children avail of this and have made very good progress with their reading. The AR programme will be available before and after school from Monday 16th September.
